





Durango Transit

Durango Transit provides a fixed route bus service throughout the city of Durango. The Durango Transit fixed route system operates 7 days a week from 7am - 8:30pm, year round.

Opportunity Bus

The city of Durango operates a door-to-door paratransit service called the,
Opportunity Bus. The Opportunity Bus is a paratransit service operated by the City of Durango that provides transportation service to qualifying persons with disabilities, as outlined in the Americans with Disabilities Act, and senior citizens aged 60 or older.

ROAD RUNNER TRANSIT

Road Runner Transit

Road Runner Transit connects the La Plata County areas of Ignacio to Durango and Bayfield to Durango with medical services, jobs, education, and shopping. This is a public transportation system. All routes leave at the scheduled time.

It is recommended to be at your stop at least 5 minutes early and visible to the driver.





ROAR Coalition

Recognizing Opportunities Around Resilience (ROAR) is a group of people from all walks of life working to reduce risk factors and increase protective factors for young people living in La Plata County.

The ROAR Coalition works to reduce substance use by using evidence based prevention science.

Protective factors: characteristics associated with a lower likelihood of negative outcomes or that reduce a risk factor impact. Example: Having close relationships with peers and trusted adults.

Risk factors: characteristics at the biological, psychological, family, community, or cultural level that are associated with a higher likelihood of negative outcomes. Example: Easy access to alcohol.
